Walton County Cuts Ribbon on New Regional **Beach Access**

On the morning of October 13, the Walton County Board of County Commissioners, alongside the Walton County Beach Operations and Tourism Departments, held a ribboncutting ceremony for the new Scenic Gulf Drive Regional Beach Access.

"There is a lot of hard work that goes into completing something like this, and to see it come to fruition is a great feeling," Tourism Director Matt Algarin said. "Anytime we can open a new beach access and provide the opportunity for our residents and visitors to enjoy the sugar white sands is a good day. The beach is a gathering place. It is where people can come to make lifelong memories."

The project first gained traction in 2017 when the county purchased the 2.1-acre property for \$5.75 million. Additional project costs, such as permitting and construction, were estimated at \$3.4 million, for a total cost of \$9.15 million. All expenses related to the project were covered using the tourist development tax, a 5-percent tax collected on short-term rentals.

Located at 907 Scenic Gulf Drive in Miramar Beach, this new beach access boasts 400 feet of sugar-white sand along the Gulf of Mexico. It showcases a coastal cottage design, mirroring the county's other beach accesses. It features 18 vehicle parking spaces, nine golf cart parking spaces, bike parking, a large deck plaza, a 360-foot ADA-accessible boardwalk/

dune walkover, restroom facilities, and a picnic pavilion with dune walkover.

"We are proud to offer this to the public. It is a great facility and a great amenity to have," Walton County Commissioner Michael Barker said.

Opening the Scenic Gulf Drive access brings the total number of regional beach accesses in Walton County to 10. Work is also underway on two additional regional beach accesses, Seagrove Beach RBA in the heart of Seagrove Beach and Walton Dunes RBA in the Eastern Lake community.

Each regional beach access point includes parking, restroom volunteer hours just for Thanksgiving alone. Bring Back the Praise!

You don't have to teach a dog to be a dog... you must instead allow a dog to be a dog; a dog that lives in a human world, so to speak, when we take them on as our companions. As a dog owner, you should be accepting of the fact that you must meet its innate needs. This is achieved through satisfying your dog's drives for certain things like hunting, retrieving, chasing, playing, among others. It is imperative to have good communication, set boundaries, and show fair leadership. Dogs like leadership, believe it or not. As a pack animal it is instilled deep in their psyche to follow the leader - not to BE the leader. You don't have to attempt to be an alpha dog in human skin. Likewise, you cannot treat your dog like a human. There are enough examples of why this is wrong they could fill a page by themselves. You just need to be a good human leader for them to follow your lead, a zookeeper of sorts.

Communication is a multifaceted and oftentimes highly challenging piece of the puzzle. My experience spans decades in the dog world, and I have very rarely seen a forced relationship work with a dog. If a dog does not want to do something, it won't do it until convinced there

is some benefit in doing it. The touchy part of that is finding the thing the dog will see as a benefit, then not overdoing the benefit so the dog only elicits a behavior for a motivator. The motivator typically will be a treat or toy and we are neither going to have



those things constantly available nor should we need to. When we fall into this trap it moves the relationship to one based solely on bribery. While this might work for the short term and has value for conditioning, the bribery mechanism can lose value with many dogs and create frustration for humans. The force mechanism typically loses value in its absence, often testing a

dog's resolve to avoid doing the wrong thing so it can satisfy its own desires.

Instead of force or bribery, we must teach dogs that our praise is enough, that their actions have value to us, that they make us happy. In turn, they are happy with our happiness and resounding praise of them. I challenge people to remember the first time they laid eyes on their new dog or cute little puppy. Muster up the courage to praise it with the same enthusiasm you did back then, before it started doing bad things, before it's drives really began to show themselves to you and before its impulse to act on those drives became uncontrollable. Praise your dog for lying still and doing absolutely nothing. Praise your dog for making eye contact with you. Praise your dog for the little things and they will seek your praise for good behavior. Set boundaries and be fair!

Citizen Scientist Volunteers Needed for Walton County's Coastal Dune Lakes

By MARK MESSERLY

Walton County's Dune Lakes are ecological treasures, and there are opportunities to help monitor and preserve these unique environmental systems. In addition to recreational activities, the lakes store and filter water, and provide unique transitional habitats for a unique mix of plants and animals.

The Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (basinalliance.org), a non-profit organization, helps to sustain our dune lakes and related watersheds, through monitoring, research, and education. Research efforts inform strategic actions for preservation, restoration, and guidance for future development.

Citizen Scientist Volunteer opportunities (basinalliance.org/ volunteer/) include taking lake water quality samples. In some cases a vessel is provided by the Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance (basinalliance.org), others require a volunteer-provided vessel. Following a training session, volunteers will be provided with the equipment used to take samples at specified locations. Data from the samples are analyzed at University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences. Reports are generated



for each lake indicating short, and long term trends. Additional resources, including a link to the Coastal Dune Lakes Advisory Board, are available on the Walton County Coastal Dune Lakes web page www.co.walton. fl.us/97/Coastal-Dune-Lakes.

All of the coastal dune lakes with the exception of Fuller are accessible from the beach. Other Lakes have additional access points for public use. The Timpoochee Trail is a wonderful way



to see nearly all of the lakes – it is a multimodal trail which is great for hiking and biking. The trail runs along County Road 30A, providing stunning views of all of the coastal dune lakes from Stallworth to Camp Creek

There are incentives as well: Potentially lower taxes, managing their wealth and guidance on estate planning. Giving can be as straightforward as a cash, check or even stock donation. Other assets might qualify as well. This can be cumbersome, however, if you have several nonprofits you want to support.

An idea growing in popularity is the Donor Advised Fund or DAF. Raymond James calls it "the new face of giving' and it is the fastest growing charitable vehicle in America. DAFs are public charities and qualify under IRS section 501(c)3. They take in contributions from the giver by way of cash (or check) but also securities (stocks and bonds, for example). Depending on someone's situation, a tax deduction might even apply. The DAF in turn invests the contributions into mutual funds for growth or income or preservation of capital.

Note the wording of "donor advised." That means that the donor can directly ask the DAF to periodically, or when they would like to, send contributions on to another charity. That charity could be educational (a college, university or any educational nonprofit), religious (church), human services or foundations (educational, athletic as example). In the meantime, any amounts not given can be left to grow and accumulate over time, for many years.

In the end, giving is simpler - one contribution to one charity, which can then be dispersed as you request or advise. Many firms allow you to do this online or even delegate it to your adviser, at your direction. You can title or name the account as well. These accounts also allow you to name successor donor advisers or a final recipient charity of

the value of the account at your death. Many people appreciate having this available for making donations to their schools, churches, hospitals and various local or national/international causes.

Donors are urged to consult their attorneys, accountants or tax advisers with respect to questions relating to the deductibility of various types of contributions to a Donor-Advised Fund for federal and state tax purposes.

New Guy Harvey Program Boosts Marine Biology Education in Local Schools



Thanks to a sizable grant from The St. Joe Community Foundation, a Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation program designed to assist local teachers will soon be expanding into Walton County. The St. Joe Community Foundation will be presenting a check for \$96,175 at the Walton County School District meeting on Tuesday, October 18, at 5 p.m. in the South Walton High School Media Center.

The grant will pay for Walton County teachers to receive interactive hands-on training in the Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation's STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math) curriculum. Serving the Community from the Sand to the Snow – **Meet Venturing Crew 562**

Everyone, or at least almost evervone, has heard of Boy Scouts of America (BSA), but few may know about Venturing, a core program of BSA, or know we have our own local crew. I recently spoke to CJ Inman, a local scout and crewmember, about what Venturing has to offer.

So what is Venturing? Established in 1998, it's a co-ed, youthled program for ages 14-20 that let's members choose their own activities where they will use their scouting skills while developing other vital skills such as leadership, planning, organization, communication and responsibility. There is a crew committee of adults, led by a committee chair, but the crew itself is led by youth crew members that are elected to such positions as president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. "With Venturing it's a little

bit more of a mature experience than boy scouts," stated CJ. "Because it's an older audience that's participating, it is a lot more truly youth led. We're the ones that make the decisions, planning everything is up to us. The adults are just there to make sure everything goes to plan. It's a lot more responsibility."

Local Venturing Crew 562 was established just this year, and is affiliated with Troop 562. They meet at St Rita in Santa Rosa Beach on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of every month. It was the idea of CJ's scouting friend, Brighton Cardenas, who is the crew's first president. "He wanted to see a new Venturing crew in our area because the next closest one is a couple of hours away. He



wanted it to be more accessible to bring more people into the program." Said CJ. "Right now we're only going to get a few years out of it, but it will benefit the community for years to come."

To get things started, the crew took a survey to see what type of things members were interested in, and if anyone has an idea for an event, they are encouraged to share it at a meeting. "Ideas are absolutely heard," said CJ. "Everybody's there to work together to make this a fun experience."

The crew has had a couple of meetings and unofficial outings, and have more planned events to come, including a trip to the snowy north in winter 2023. "The big event we're planning for is Okpik," said CJ. "It's a huge

Okpik is a cold-weather adventure program created by the BSA Northern Tier High Adventure Base located in the Great North Woods of northern Minnesota and Canada. Here they will learn how to camp and cook in winter conditions as well as dog sled, snowshoe and ice fish.

When talking to CJ about Venturing, I felt the sense of team building that Venturing is about. "The thing that hits home with me with Venturing, you're forced to learn how to get close to the people that you're with. It could literally be that your life depends on it so you learn to trust those people and value them," stated CJ. "If you have a strength that they might be struggling with, you guys come together, to work together to solidify that for both

of you." It's an experience like Okpik that will help the crew learn to trust and depend on one another.

While Venturing crews are working to strengthen their leadership, team building and accountability, their core values still embrace the BSA adherence of duty and service to others. "Doing your duty to your country also has a metaphorical meaning. Rather than just one country, scouting as a whole has a duty to the world because it's the world scouting movement." Stated CJ. With Venturing it's about the bigger picture. "How can I leave a footprint that our descendants can follow in?"

If you are interested in helping Crew 562 with earning money towards their Okpik adventure, they are currently selling coffee out of Lucky Goat in Tallahassee. They are also planning events like a seafood boil in DeFuniak Springs and a BBQ in Freeport. Crew 562 will also be working with Troop 562 selling Christmas Trees during the holidays for a percentage of the proceeds.

I grew up believing emotions were inefficient and to be avoided. Emotions, even the "good" ones, were not to be trusted. They were to be overcome by being tough and powering through. So, I learned

knowledging them is a pathway to growth and progress? What if there is a depth of life and relationship to be experienced through emotional awareness? What if emotions aren't something to escape but the path to the life, relationships and influence you have been searching for?

Four Steps to Allow Emotions to Work for You:

Slow down to speed up

The speed and busyness of life is one way we are taught emotions are to be ignored. There is simply no time for emotions. We pursue more work or activities as a means of escaping or numbing emotions. However, if emotions have purpose and can provide important information about the abundant life path we desire, we must slow down and create space to experience and acknowledge them. When we create space for emotions, we bring them to the light instead of allowing them to drain our energy while operating in the shadows. Next time you sense an emotion, whether comfortable or uncomfortable, pause and take three to four deep breaths, allow yourself some space to experience the emotion, and then move on to the next step.

Name the emotion

At first glance, naming the emotion appears to be simple. However, this can be difficult without a strong emotional vocabulary. When asked how we are feeling, we often have two or three go-to answers such as "fine," "good," "frustrated," or a favorite of my son's, "meh." If moving beyond words like these is difficult, you are not alone. A simple hack is finding and printing an emotion word bank. We have a printable "Feeling Word List" available in the Resources tab at Journeybravely.com. Keep a picture of this on your phone or fridge. When you are tempted to use words like good, fine, or meh, look at the word bank and find words like thankful, valued, respected, overwhelmed, relaxed, betrayed.

What's the story

After naming the emotion, consider the narrative behind the emotion. How are your beliefs shaping your emotional interpretation. If you are feeling rejected when your friend turned you down for lunch, try investigating your story about your friend's intentions. Are you believing you aren't important to your friend? When you identify your emotional story, it is important to test the story with three questions. Is the story true? Is it kind? Is it helpful? If the answer to any of these questions is "no," it's time to adopt a new narrative. Try challenging the original story with a version that gives your friend the benefit of the doubt. Perhaps he would like to get together another time because your friendship is important to him.

What are your action steps?

Now that you understand your emotion, how will it guide your actions? Maybe it's time to replace old thought patterns that are no longer serving you. Maybe there are relational boundaries you need to establish. Maybe it's time to set boundaries with news, social media or other cultural input. Maybe it's time to start saying "no" so you can slow down and be present with yourself and others in more meaningful ways. Remember, you are ridiculously in charge. You largely get to make your own decisions as well as what and who you allow in your life. Emotions can help make these decisions more efficient if we give them the space to do so.

Depression During the Holidays

The holidays are coming up and these are the best times of the year. At least that's what we are led to believe. In fact, the holidays can be very stressful for people. Even though most people enjoy the holidays, nearly forty percent of people report increased stress and anxiety during these times. This often leads to substance abuse, relapse, or other worsening medical conditions.

In preparation for these potential stressful times, I'd like to tell you about some of the not so commonly discussed effects of hormone replacement. Doctors at Ascension Sacred Heart Emerald Coast are the first in Northwest Florida to offer a new, minimally invasive procedure to relieve heartburn, acid reflux, and other symptoms of Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD). The procedure is called TIF, which stands for transoral incisionless fundoplication. According to the National Institutes of Health, researchers estimate 20 percent of people in the United States are living with GERD.

Doctors recently performed the first 10 TIF procedures at the hospital and say it has provided a new option for some patients.

«We are excited to offer this procedure at Ascension Sacred Heart Emerald Coast," said Dr. Thomas Shaknovsky, a general surgeon. "This minimally invasive procedure can help people who are not getting rid of their discomfort with lifestyle modification and medication."

In the TIF procedure, a gastroenterologist uses a flexible instrument called an endoscope and a special TIF device to repair or rebuild the antireflux valve through the mouth, which helps restore the body's natural protection against reflux, which occurs when stomach acid flows back into the esophagus. Since there is no incision, it could mean a quicker, less painful recovery for some patients. Dr. Shaknovsky says his patients no longer have to rely on medication to treat their condition after the procedure. The TIF procedure may be right for those who are concerned about taking medications over the long term. "With so many people liv-

New Mental Health Resources coming to Okaloosa and Walton County Parents

Children's Volunteer Health Network (CVHN) and The Youth Mental Health Project are introducing regional chapters of The Parent Support Network to the panhandle. A Pastor's Ponderings: Thankful for God, Family, Country

"I have been young, and now am old; Yet I have not seen the righteous forsaken,

Nor his descendants begging bread. He is ever merciful, and lends; And his descendants are blessed." (Psalm 37:25-26, NKJV)

There I stood in Capernaum, where Jesus once provided bread for the multitudes and healed the sick. The weather was perfect. The full moon lit up the night and three hours of unadulterated worship rocked the hillsides. Praising God with gusto came easily with the great throng of pilgrims gathered on the north shore of the Sea of Galilee. Two thousand Christians assembled from all over the world in ancient Capernaum to kick off the Feast of Tabernacles and walk in the footsteps of Christ. Faith was on full display.

Similar to our Thanksgiving celebration, the Feast of Tabernacles is an annual holiday in Israel that commemorates the Israelites' 40-year journey out of Egypt. God provided manna to eat and water for them in the wilderness. They slept in tents, called "succots," or temporary dwellings. This holiday is a time of joy for the Jews and the Christians who visit. Jesus wants to tabernacle among us today if we invite him.

While in Nazareth, the minimalism of Christ's life struck me in Joseph's workshop, literally a cave. Questions probed my mind. Do we adorn our faith with so much pomp and ceremony that we miss the power of his love and the simplicity of His teachings?

Shifting to southern Israel, we explored Hebron, where Abraham received the promise that God would bless his family. Recent excavations reveal stone pathways traveled by Abraham 4,000 years ago. While offering his son Isaac as a sacrifice, God interrupted him with a ram caught in a thicket and taught Abraham that God will provide Himself a sacrifice. I thanked God for sending Christ as our eternal sacrifice.

Landing more than 6,000 miles to the west of Israel, we arrived in South Carolina. Our grandson, Josiah, was about to graduate from Marine boot camp on Parris Island. The family gathered to celebrate his achievement. Fourteen of us stood at rapt attention among thousands of family members of the 374 graduating Marines. The Marine Corps band played in the shadow of the statue commemorating the battle of Iwo Jima. My family cheered them on, along with hundreds of other families representing every walk of life in our pluralistic culture, every one of them proud of their Marine and their country. My daughter and the mother of our Marine is fiercely loyal and unyielding as iron. She whooped and hollered, shouting above the din, "I love you Josiah!"

Waves of pride and patriotism washed over me as I watched my grandson march in strict formation with his company. The innocent baby-faced toddler I once knew stood as a strong, disciplined United States Marine willing to lay down his life for his faith, family and country. That's when stark, raving fear ruined the parade.

Will the Corps send my grandson into battle in some far-off desert or jungle? Will an enemy's weapon tear through his flesh and bone? Will he come home in a body bag? These thoughts tormented me while the band played on. Only God knows these answers.

Moses showed us that even in the wilderness, God is good and always provides. I learned from Father Abraham to place my family in God's hands because he is so faithful. I learned from my savior Jesus that God is truly with us through the battles of life. Like King David of old, I have learned to be thankful for my God, my family, and my country. Happy Thanksgiving.

The Road to Redemption: Children in Crisis and The Children's Neighborhood

When she heard the authoritative knock on her front door, she quickly ran to her baby brother and grabbed his hand. Her eyes were great pools of fear and, with a trembling voice, she begged to not be separated from her little brother. Their home, such as it was, was home no longer, and she didn't know what would happen next.

The vision for Children in Crisis, a non-profit 501(c)(3), began in 2002 in a living room of concerned citizens who worked in school systems and foster care. They were concerned about how many times children, removed from their abusive and unsafe homes, were shuffled from one foster home to another because of the severe shortage of foster parents. More often than not, siblings were separated, further traumatizing the children. This core group wanted a better way to meet the needs of these vulnerable children, with a vision of opening a foster care neighbor-

for children removed from abusive environments

on short notice, where they can stay temporarily. Then there are five family-style foster homes where foster parents live on site, and eight studio apartments for young adults who have aged out of foster care but aren't ready to be on their own vet.

Children in Crisis' mission is to keep brothers and sisters together. They've worked dili-

gently to obtain the funding to build the neighborhood and have placed foster parents in each home to watch over and care for children, keeping brothers and sisters together, greatly

mitigating the need to move them from O REDEA

one home to another; thereby giving them a better chance to heal and grow strong. Every adult who works at

The Children's Neighborhood lets the children know they

are in a safe environment. Many of the kids that are removed from homes arrive with only a Walmart bag of a few items. Many don't even know how to use a shower. And because many have lived not knowing when they would eat again, hide food in their rooms. These are just some of the behaviors these abused children need help with overcoming.

Children in Crisis has seen lives transformed and children able to trust adults again and flourish at school because of the unique setting at The Children's Neighborhood.

Their greatest need right now are foster parents. They have two empty homes waiting to accept and house children, but no foster parents to receive them. Fostering is a calling, and though it's not an easy job, God equips those who are prepared to do the work.

The Bible doesn't directly instruct us to be foster parents, but it does speak of taking care of the fatherless and the widow and loving each other sacrificially. We are told to take in strangers and be like the Good Samaritan who

stopped and got involved, giving his time and money to care for another.

Who is our neighbor? The person in need who God puts in front of us.

family during my childhood. After my father died in a pretty horrible way, people would invite us to spend holidays with them because they felt sorry for us. We would join them, but it was awful.

Discovering Inspiration in What Drives Us Nuts!

A few days ago, I shared a drink and some sandwiches with a couple of work mates at an airport eatery, killing time before our respective flights back home departed. As guys are often wont to do, our conversation drifted into a Seinfeldian discussion of observations and subsequent questions. Given we were eating perhaps all three of us sensed a subliminal urging into a culinary-oriented discourse of food, food preparation, and kitchen appliances.

Which brought us to the plight of the automatic dishwasher.

All of us married, we quickly reached universal agreement that rinsing and then loading the dishwasher was not such a disdainful chore, but rather it was the unloading that was loathsome. We evaluated the source of our contempt and concluded two factors were of influence. One, there seems to be a higher degree of thought that goes into the emptying process. Where do the utensils go and how should they be configured? When unloading, does other cookware need to first be moved to accommodate those most recently cleansed? Have bowls or glasses been overturned in the cleaning process and accumulated that dingy "graywater," that requires a manual re-rinsing?

The second consideration was the manner in that the kitchenware may have been loaded initially. Had larger items such as colanders or large measuring cups occupied significant space, when they might have been hand washed at the outset, thus deferring the automatic washing process and subsequent unloading for at least 12 more hours?

No remedy was reached for our dilemma, except for feeling a bit



more lightened through discovering mutual comradeship and "misery" by talking it through.

What is your peeve? Is it the toilet paper positioned up or down? The driver's seat moved too far forward, or back? The tube of toothpaste squeezed from the middle, or front?

Enough of these annoyances piled on top of one another can result in aggravation, anger, and even lashing out at an unaware loved one or bystander.

Why do these seemingly inconsequential things annoy us?

An article in "Psychology Today" examined our reactions. It revealed that though there can be physical and mental factors contributing: sleep deprivation, stress, illness, financial concerns, oftentimes, the fundamental issue is more a sense of our "space" having been invaded, reflecting a need to "reset." What are ways to step back and discipline ourselves to rethink? The article shared five examples:

Set a limit. Someone asks you an irksome question that you really don't want to answer. One approach can be to respond with "I'm not prepared to discuss that now." Another can be "That is really difficult for me to talk about at this time."

A need to protect your time. Little intrusions matter. Even the five minutes it takes to unload the dishwasher is time to take care of another chore, or "check in" with a loved one.

Identify another approach. Will waking up 15 minutes earlier help? Can tasks be broken up into diverse increments such as take out the trash, watch a 30-minute show, then unload the dishes?

Resentment and anger. Speak out. Don't stuff it. "I feel I'm doing a great share of the chores.

I really could use help.³

Finally, it may be us that suffers from perfectionism. You get mad at yourself for falling short of your own expectations. You're human, give yourself a break. Likewise, if another person fails to live up to your standards, either express your hopes, or try to see things from a different perspective. Better yet, is it worth hanging onto or should it be let go?

Rethink, reframe, refocus. My Mother-In-Law had a saying posted in her house-"Thank God for dirty dishes, they have a tale to tell; while other folks go hungry, we're eating very well." Time to unload.

During the first year of college, I was elected freshman class president. Two days before the first monthly meeting that I was to preside over, a tornado ripped through the city destroying dozens of homes. I proposed we do our part and help those who were less fortunate. The entire class voted unanimously to volunteer their time on Saturday by cleaning up residential areas which were hit the hardest. When Saturday morning came, only seven students out of the hundreds of freshmen actually showed up to help. It was at that moment I

learned a profound lesson. We can share our response, have the ability to help, but not accept response + ability. It's easy to speak up. It's harder to show up. The word and the deed should go hand in hand.

What is a response without responsibility? Let's look at a couple of examples. If a city says they are a sanctuary city but refuse to provide sanctuary, that is a response without responsibility. If some say they support adoption but do not adopt, become a foster parent, or at least support an adoption organization, that is a response without responsibility. In no way does this make the response wrong. It just makes it weak and hollow.

When we do take responsibility to make a difference with the resources we have, it is important not to guilt trip others, or become involved in virtue signaling. I know someone who volunteers by assisting patients in a hospice. I do not feel guilty that I don't have time during this season of my life to do the same. There are dozens of worthy causes I do not contribute to. All of us are all limited on how much responsi-



bility we can take on. I can't help everyone, but I can help some-one.

Another pitfall to avoid is volunteering others. It took me years to realize that volunteering myself was often "volunteering my wife," even if she was not going to be directly involved. If I agree to coach a ball team, be a camp counselor for a week, help children with disabilities, or volunteer in youth ministry at my church, that equals less time for me to be at home helping my family. Often, my wife has handled the chores I would have been doing if I was home. Every time I went on a mission trip, I had to remind myself how blessed I am to have an awesome spouse who is willing to do so many extra things behind the scenes so I could be gone. No one likes to be "volun-told" (told they have to volunteer). It is wise to ask your spouse or family members for their blessing before taking on new responsibilities.

Maybe it's been a while since you volunteered at a local church, school or community event. Maybe it has been a while since you contributed to Shriners Hospitals or Saint Jude's Hospital. Refrain from becoming involved out of guilt or pressure. Ask yourself what is a good fit for you. Usually, when people buy vehicles, they kick the tires and take it out for a test drive. Approach volunteering in a similar way. Don't make long-term commitments until you discover what you are most fulfilled doing. You may believe you will be happy working with fifth graders, but later discover you enjoy working with high schoolers instead. You may think soccer is the sport you want to coach, but later find out you enjoy t-ball instead. You can't do everything, but always remember, you can do something.

I cannot take resources with me once I leave this earth. You cannot take resources with you once you leave this earth. One day yours will be gone. One day mine will be gone. The only thing which will be left is ours.

I cannot believe the holiday season is here. It has been nice getting a break from the high humidity and I am especially enjoying those attic inspections this time of year. With the holiday season, inheritably comes more energy use. Family and friends come to visit, school holiday breaks and the enjoyment of cooking and entertaining those traditional meals. All mean, more energy use. Here are a few holiday energy savings tips to help brighten your nights and lower your energy bills.

Switch to LED lights when decorating and in general. LED lights use 80 to 90% less energy than incandescent lights. It is estimated that 4 strands of LED lights will save \$30 this month

compared to 4 strands of the traditional lighting. When I changed out my landscape lighting bulbs to LED, they were brighter, looked great, will last longer, and use less energy. It is also a clever idea to use timers to reduce the amount of time holiday lighting stays on, plus one less thing to worry about.

When cooking the holiday feast, do not forget about the smaller appliances. Microwaves, slow cookers, and multi-use smart appliances all use less energy and give off less heat than ovens and stoves. Also consider co-cooking. If one dish needs to bake at 400° and the other at 350°, consider sharing the baking time and set your oven at 375° and bake both dishes.

We typically use our com-

mon appliances more during the holidays. Many of our water heaters are set to 140° from the manufacturer. Lowering the setting to 120° will save energy and money. When showering, many of us will start with the hot water turned all the way up and then add cold water for a comfortable temperature. By doing this, you are cooling the hot water which you spent energy and money to heat. Lowering water heater temperatures to 120° on your hot water heater saves energy and money.

Do not run dishwashers when they are half full, this wastes energy. Fill up those baskets and try adding a drying agent. These agents help lower the surface tension of water causing it to sheet off dishes, using less drying time,

saving you money. Also, use cold water in your clothes washer. Most new clothes washers and detergents are designed for cold water and get your clothes just as clean. When drying clothes, throw a few dryer balls into the dryer with your load, this will reduce drying time by preventing laundry from clumping allowing the warm air to circulate better. If your dryer has an auto dry option (moisture sensing), use that option instead of timed dry and clean the lint trap between loads-this improves air circulation and increases the efficiency of the drver.

If you plan to leave this holiday season, think about automating your home. Put exterior and interior lighting on timers to avoid being on all day and night. Add a thermostat which you can control via Wi-Fi and your smart phone. In the event we get a cold streak or heat wave during the time you are away, you can control your home's temperature. Also remember to unplug those energy vampire electronics which use energy even when turned off.

Buying local foods and goods not only supports our community but saves energy by reducing transportation related energy costs.

Every time a storm threatens our state, we are reminded of how many homeowners and business owners either do not carry flood and wind insurance at all, or have inadequate limits to cover their loss. Unfortunately, the 2022 Atlantic hurricane season runs to Nov. 30.

When Hurricane Ian hit our state, the property insurance market was already in peril. The market was the most volatile in the U.S. well before Hurricane Ian formed, and will most likely

become even more unstable in the wake of the storm. The market has been strained under billion-dollar losses, insolvencies and skyrocketing premiums. The massive storm barreled into southwest Florida, delivering catastrophic winds, rain and flooding. The majority of the estimated losses in Florida come from wind damage, estimated between \$22 billion and \$32 billion, while insured storm surge losses in the state are expected to be an additional \$6 billion to \$15 billion.

The increasing unpredictability of hurricane threats underscores the need for property owners – especially those close to water – to raise their standard of preparation. The most significant risks for these homeowners are wind and water. Windows are particularly vulnerable points during a hurricane, but any exterior points – including shingles, gutters, and railings – are at risk from wind. Homes, in general, should have window protection in advance. Owners should either board up the windows or install hurricane shutters. This is one of the more important decisions individuals make.

Without adequate reinforcement, windows can be a source of indoor damage during a storm. A home's occupants could also be injured near windows when a hurricane strikes. Similarly, doors could become a weak point, so these entryways should also be secured

Although most standard homeowners and business insurance policies can include wind coverage, they do not cover flooding. So it is important to have protection from flooding associated with tropical storms, hurricanes, heavy rains, broken levees, outdated or clogged drainage systems, rapid accumulation of rainfall and other conditions that impact our area. Almost everyone in a participating community of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) can buy flood insurance. Recently, Florida has become the leader in the country in encouraging private markets to respond to our needs with competitive alternatives, but the prevailing market condition will slow down this development.

A flood is defined by FEMA as a general and temporary condition in which two or more properties of normally dry land are inundated by water. Just because you haven't experienced a flood in the past does not mean you won't in the future. Flood risks are based partly on history, but also on rainfall, river-flow and tidal-surge data, topography, fold-control measures and changes due to building and development.

The NFIP's Dwelling Form offers coverage up to a maximum of \$250,000 for building property and up to \$100,000 for contents and the Commercial Form provides up to a maximum of \$500,000 for building and/or contents. Both should be purchased as well as excess flood for limits up to the replacement cost of the dwelling and personal property over the basic limits. Recent storms and predictions of a future with bigger and stronger storms highlight more than ever the importance of flood insurance.

You can buy flood insurance through the NFIP no matter where you live if your community participates, except in Coastal Barrier Resources System (CBRS) areas. For properties in these areas, the private market is available.

We recommend you call an experienced insurance agency with access to the NFIP as well as private markets to help evaluate your flood exposures.
