

very hard physically to be the best we can be."

From responding to medical events to performing water rescues to locating missing people, to answering everyday questions about the area, lifeguards serve not only as first responders, but



community stewards for visitors and locals alike.


SWFD's Beach Safety and Surf Rescue program first began in 2006 and has since grown to encompass more than 50 to 60 staff members every summer. Some of these lifeguards serve in a seasonal role, while others work full-time, year-round to provide coverage across the beach.

The agency continues looking for any qualified individuals to join the team as a lifeguard in 2024, but hopes are high for the year thanks to the endless community support.

"We have been backed by our locals and longtime visitors since the inception of the program," Vaughan said. "We need their help educating others this year about the importance of following the beach flag system and swimming near one of our lifeguards. We're most effective when we can physically see swimmers and prevent any emergency from occurring before it's too late."



# Hurricane Season is Less Than 100 Days Away – Is Your Roof Ready??

Living in Florida comes with its own set of challenges, including hot summers, intense humidity, and the ever-present threat of hurricanes. In contrast, El Niño, marked by warming eastern Pacific waters, typically increases wind shear in the Atlantic, hindering storm development or steering them into the Atlantic as we saw last year. La Niña's influence on global weather patterns is significant. It leads to less wind shear across the Atlantic, meaning atmospheric conditions are more favorable for tropical storms and hurricanes in the basin. La Niña events also contribute to cooler equatorial waters in the Pacific, impacting global weather patterns. While there are currently no official forecasts from CSU, NOAA, or other outlets, considering the potential influence of La Niña and the continuation of warmer-than-average ocean temperatures, an above-average season in terms of named storms is plausible.

With hurricane season loom-

# Insights for Investors: Don't Forget about Capital Preservation

Investors and their advisors often talk about sleeping well at night. We were recently reminded of the acronym of SWAN – Sleep Well at Night. We have seen consistently over time that nothing is more important to savers and investors – when considering their wealth – nothing trumps the ability or opportunity to sleep well at night.

We also think it important to point out to investors, when making an investment decision, to not lose sight of preserving capital, for at least a portion of their assets. That might be SWAN money.

What Black about Swans? Have you ever heard of that term before? Most swans are ivory colored and when gazing upon them, nothing stands out, unless you spot a black swan. In the world of investing and the economy, a black swan is an event that no one sees coming, however is always on the horizon. It may not always be visible, particularly when things are going well. Ned Johnson, for many years was the Chairman and CEO of Fidelity Investments. He was heard many times saying just that: "We are most vulnerable when things are going well."

What do we, along with a lot of other people, see as black swans on the horizon? We will start with China. For many years the growth and ascent of China was seen as remarkable; plus, it attracted a lot of investor interest. China now, however, is experiencing a significant economic downturn. Some expect this to last and that government measures may not be enough to stop the decline. The term "Japanification" is being heard and seen lately. Japan, in the 90s on onward continued decline in demand and has yet to recover. We think that China's impact on the world is significant enough that it is now a black swan.

**Commercial Real Estate.** Many U.S. banks have made substantial loans for the construction and purchase of real estate throughout the country. This expansion of lending was substantial over the past decade and accelerated with the accommodating Federal Reserve action on rates and the money supply. Many of those loans are coming due in the next few years and perhaps will renew at much higher rates. And the underlying properties might not carry the same value. Office buildings have somewhat lower occupancy now and that could add for lower values. It is not possible to know for sure if this will have an impact (from defaults, for example) on the banking sector as well as the economy. Nonetheless, we see it as a black swan on the horizon.

Third, is the so-called shadow banking system. There are a lot of examples in the system: Hedge Funds, Private Equity funds but also money market funds, exchange traded funds as well as securities broker dealers. The existence of this system is critical to the ongoing function of the economy. However, it did play a role, as did the banking system in the financial crisis in 2008. According to Business Insider, "U.S. banks have given out \$1 trillion of loans to nonregulated "shadow banks." We understand that a substantial amount of that was to hedge funds and private equity funds. Market volatility can have an impact on many of the borrowers in this system. So, we see that as risk on the horizon.

The mere existence of black swans is nothing new. It is part of the reality and experience in investing. That is why we also encourage our readers and investors to always have a plan to preserve capital. In other words, have a plan and strategy for asset allocation base upon goals, time frame and, ultimately, risk tolerance.

How do you go about



preserving capital? One way to is to have your emergency and opportunity money in a bank account, a CD or perhaps a money market account or fund. When it comes to your overall investments and time horizon, bonds might play a role in future capital preservation. While bonds can and do fluctuate on the open market every day (and are reflected in your statement value) they have a maturity and ultimate value. It is a way of knowing what you have and when you will have it. The return of capital, of course, is based upon the issuer. U.S. Treasuries and U.S. government agency bonds would be considered the most conservative. However, investors should also consider municipal bonds. Corporate bonds would follow next.

Some might wonder if it is the right time to invest in bonds or if they make sense if you are trying to grow your assets. Warren Buffet has always suggested that investors not be in a hurry. He was talking about stocks probably, but the lesson can be the same for a long-term plan for your investments. Many investors build their portfolio not only to be time, risk and goal appropriate, but age appropriate as well.

# Seahawks Close Season with Region 1-4A Title

The South Walton High School girls' soccer team finished the season with an impressive 16-2 record earning them the 10th spot in the Florida state rankings and 19th nationally. The Seahawks won the Region 1-4A tournament, 4-2, against the Stanton Blue Devils out of Jacksonville on February 14, 2024. It marked the team's sixth straight home win. Senior Macy Chambers and junior Maiya Bowers scored all four of the team's goals, with Chambers notching her 21st goal of the season and contributing to the team's two of four assists.

Despite operating under a demanding schedule and losing key players before and during the season, the Seahawks entered the state semifinals with a 16-1 standing. Bowers, reflecting on the team's journey, was initially apprehensive about their success "We lost ten, eleven seniors last year. It was a big blow to the program," she says. However, their initial victories boosted morale and instilled confidence in the team. "Oh, wow, maybe we got this!" Bowers later exclaimed. The mid-season loss of top goal scorer Aliza Mannon required adjustments to the lineup, with Chambers transitioning from goalie to a different position. "I had to transfer over into playing attack, so it was a really big difference. I had to change my mindset and make sure I was doing what was right for the team."

Sophomore Jayden Lo Bue-Holzer recalls, "We did lose a really valuable player in the season, [and] we definitely had to adjust to that in order to keep going. We all had positive attitudes the whole year [and] it kept going."

Freshman Chloe Davis believes it all worked out for the Seahawks, "We got to be more of a team and know one another better." Their journey included competing against and beating a formidable lineup of 5A and 6A teams, showcasing their resilience and skill. In late fall, they pummeled Choctawhatchee, 7-0, and Fort Walton Beach, 8-0, in their first and sixth games, respectively. Subsequently, they rolled over Navarre (4-1), Niceville (3-2), and Gulf Breeze (2-1) before heading to the playoffs in



late January. Assistant Coach Jud Boulware attributes their success to the close-knit bond among the 30-member team, many of whom have played together since childhood. Head Coach Frank Casillo emphasizes the importance of trust and collaboration on the field, contributing to their achievements, "Everybody supports each other, and you see it on the field."

Despite their best efforts, the Seahawks fell short in the state semifinals on February 22, 2024 against Academy of the Holy Names, 0-3, ending their quest for a state championship title. "That last game, I kind of had to settle in my heart, 'okay, it's over,' but I knew I did all I could," reflects Chambers, who will be going on to play soccer for Southern Union Community College in Alabama next year. "Knowing it was my last season, I really wanted to leave everything out there."

As the team bids farewell to its graduating seniors, the Seahawks prepare themselves for the upcoming season. Davis anticipates her sophomore year on the team, aiming to maintain strong communication with her teammates, while Lo Bue-Holzer "hopes to be more of an asset." Coach Casillo has expressed excitement about the growth and development of the players, pushing them to reach new heights in the coming season. Bowers looks forward to stepping up as a team leader in her senior year and continuing to build on the program's success, "I feel so excited. I'm going to miss the seniors; they've helped build an incredible program, and I'm excited to help carry it forward."



# Featured Seaside Prize Artist Kenn Kotara Charts New Cartographies

Hosted by the town of Seaside, Florida, the nonprofit Escape to Create (E2C) has been bringing creative talent from around the globe to enjoy monthlong artist residencies since 1993. For this season, their 31st, the residency featured the work of contemporary abstract artist Kenn Kotara as part of Seaside Prize weekend events.

Currently based in Asheville, North Carolina, Kotara's practice has evolved along a multi-disciplinary path. Following undergraduate studies in architecture at Louisiana Tech, Kotara traveled the world before returning to earn a BFA in Graphic Design and an MFA in Studio Art. His artistic output over more than three decades exhibits a vigorous curiosity about space and form, innovative architecture and structural design, and an evolving multi-dimensional application of core geometric and organic forms. Much of his artwork, widely exhibited and held in corporate collections across the U.S., is rooted in the fertile

Southern environment of his native Louisiana with its rivers, marshlands, and lush vegetation. Kotara's architectural background and southern roots permeate the abstract paintings of his recent series, barbe espagnole (Spanish moss) with works on canvas, paper, and suspended screens.

Recently retired from fulltime teaching at the college level in Asheville, Kotara, a 2008 E2C Fellow, returned to Seaside in February to advance a new body of work, "you Are here Are you" based on his lifelong fascination with traditional cartography. With this work, Kotara metaphorically investigates the connection between cities and living organisms as dynamic and interconnected systems. Pencil, pen, and acrylic paint overlay informative details, while the addition and subtraction of material layers not only obscures recognizable features but also reveals biomorphic forms connoting anatomical, biological, and cosmologi-

cal elements. Continuing a practice into how space is interpreted and manipulated, paper maps from cities in each U.S. state are transformed into topographical surfaces that visually convey the complexity of infrastructure, urban planning, and geographic features.

"We are all from somewhere or someplace. How we perceive and define these places, connotes an interconnectedness of variable forces that make up human settlements," explains Kotara.

Delving into the legacy of cartography and the visual organization of space, "you Are here Are You" highlights how mapping, originally used for geographical purposes, has expanded to describe various systems beyond physical geography, including brain functions, politics, climate, and more. This exploration invites viewers to contemplate the intricate relationships of mapping between distinct elements within a system and how they collectively function.

Escape to Create (E2C) is a volunteer-managed non-profit organization that represents the unique character of a community deeply invested in the arts. Residencies are made possible through the generosity of Seaside homeowners, merchants, and donors. Contributions directly support artist residencies, educational outreach, and cultural programs.

Whether you are just aging into Medicare, or have been receiving this benefit for years,

deciding if Medicare Advantage or a Supplement plan is best for your needs may come up many times. However, one thing is abundantly clear. It is very important to choose one of them. I've spoken with many seniors who didn't understand the importance of choosing a plan. It can not only save many thousands on medical costs but also allows you to afford you to the best care possible. This is why I write these articles. It is my job to help as many people as possible

learn all about their options for coverage.

**Medicare: The Nitty Gritty** 

Generally, the immediate importance of choosing a plan is to ensure maximum out-of-pocket costs for any possible medical issues you may experience. The co-insurance on Medicare A and B can add up to many thousands or even tens of thousands of dollars without a Supplement Plan or Advantage Plan attached. Many Medicare Advantage plans do not have a premium. So there is no extra cost to enroll, you just need to know to enroll. There are also many extra perks with Advantage plans including dental coverage, vision, free gym memberships, Prescription Drug Plans and more. Supplement plans are the most comprehensive medical coverage with a higher premium but very low out-of-pocket costs for medical care. However, Supplement plans do not include prescription drug or dental coverage like most Advantage plans cover.

If choosing a Supplement plan, it is important to remember to choose a Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) during the Initial Enrollment Period. There is a penalty added to PDP premiums, which increases every month a recipient delays purchasing the plan. PDP plans can run from \$0 to about \$100 depending on the drugs the plan covers. If you

miss enrollment during your Initial Enrollment Period, you will need to wait until Annual Election Period before enrolling in a new plan unless you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period.

What did I learn this last Annual Enrollment Period? It seems that advertising works, especially the constant ads that feature "free stuff." I had a few clients that were on Original Medicare with a great Supplement plan, and I received notice that they canceled their Supplement plans. Medicare laws prohibit me from calling, so I can only guess why.

My guess is some of them saw one of the thousands of ads promoting Medicare Advantage plans and called the 800 number. A well-trained sales agent then told them they could save money by switching off their Supplement plan and on to an Advantage plan. Premium-wise, that's true.

They will save money, but they won't have the same level of protection they had with their Supplement plan.

A significant difference between Supplement and Advantage plans is one's healthcare "gatekeeper". If you're on a Supplement plan, it's your physician who decides the treatment you receive, not your insurance carrier. If a procedure or treatment is covered by Medicare, ad-


ditional approval is not required. On a Medicare Advantage plan, the insurance company requires prior approval, and your plan can deny treatment recommended by your doctor.

On a Plan G, after the \$240 Part B deductible is paid in 2024, everything insured by Medicare is covered at 100% for the rest of the calendar year.

Advantage Plans often have Out of Pocket Maximums of \$3,500 - \$5,000, and as high as \$8.000.

Advantage plans are affordable plans that work well for most people; When people choose a Supplement plan, it's often because they want the strongest medical coverage available, and that's what Medicare Supplement plans offer. Which plan is best for you? That depends on your anticipated medical expenses and your budget. 

# **Emotionally Charged Conversations**

Are you ever moving through life and find yourself feeling very angry or hurt by someone? Maybe you are experiencing anger or hurt at a level 10 intensity and you are noticing the situation intensity level seems to be much lower than your feeling. You might then realize you're making up a story in your head about the negative, insensitive intentions of the other person. As a result, you may find yourself withdrawing, putting up walls or being confrontational in ways that compromise connection.

Emotionally charged conversations are complex to navigate and often result in people not showing up as their best version of self. Intense feelings can fuel reactivity, shutting down, harsh words, judgment, unkindness, shame and condescending tone. While you know it feels bad to experience someone's emotional reaction, you may still find yourself reacting at times. Intense emotions are inevitable but, with practice, you can create a healthy pattern of working through your own and others' reactions.

#### **10 Ways to Approach Emotionally Charged Conversations**

1. Notice when you are triggered. Pay attention to your feelings and your body. Notice

changes in body temperature, stomach, chest, feeling shaky, clenching fists, grinding teeth, tears, change in heart rate. Name feelings if you are able. "I feel embarrassed, ashamed, humiliated, angry, hurt, sad, unsafe.'

2. Calm your nervous system. Take 10-20 deep breaths, step away from the situation, journal, take a walk, nurture your pet. Engage in healthy calming skills to help your body move out of fight, flight or freeze so you can think more clearly.

3. Notice the negative intention story you are making up in your head. She didn't text me back because I'm not important. He didn't make eye contact so he must not care. My child is selfish, disrespectful and trying to irritate me. Challenge the story in your head. Is it possible their behavior has another meaning than intent to hurt you?

4. Sort past and present feelings. Intense feelings are often a sign that the present situation has triggered past wounds. Reflect on whether you are bringing memories from past interactions into the current situation. Acknowledge

> and allow past feelings to exist in a space separate from the current situation/relationship.

5. Remember the humanity

of and your history with the person. Try remembering you do not have negative intentions toward others when you emotionally react. You also do not intentionally emotionally react. Perhaps the other person had a difficult emotional moment and did not have negative intentions toward you. Remember the ongoing character of your relationship with this person. Are their intentions and behavior toward you typically positive?

6. Approach with compassionate curiosity instead of shame. Instead of, "You don't get to talk to me that way and you are being so rude and out of line," try, "You seem really overwhelmed. What's happening for you right now?" People often feel bad inside about reacting poorly. What helps them move forward is compassionate understanding rather than judgmental correction. When people feel understood with compassion, they will often apologize and move toward change.

7. Validate and support. Communicate understanding of the other's emotional **state.** Ask what support might be helpful on your end.

8. Own your part. Humbly seek to understand whether you contributed an unhelpful part in the relationship dynamic. Take responsibility by naming and apologizing for your part.

9. Address boundaries with vulnerability. Communicate kindly and directly how you were hurt and what would work better for you in the future. "When you snapped at me, that hurt my feelings and felt like you were blaming me. Now that we've talked, I understand that you were snapping because you were overwhelmed

and it was not about me. I get overwhelmed, too. When you are getting overwhelmed, it would help me if you would let me know what you need rather than snapping at me. I will be able to support you better and that will help us stay connected."

**10. Listen and repeat.** Listen with an open mind to the other person's experience and repeat this process regularly when you feel triggered in relationships.

# 6 Ways to Improve Your Heart Health in 2024

Every year, we set great resolutions for our health. Unfortunately, we usually forget them quickly. This year, don't miss the opportunity to reprioritize your heart health. Heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women according to the CDC, but many cardiac events are preventable. There are no quick fixes, but there are some easy steps you can take to make a difference.

Follow these tips to take control of your heart health in 2024.

#### Tip 1: See Your Doctor for Annual Screening

Your risk of developing heart disease increases as you age. According to research published by the Journal of the American Heart Association, people over age 40 have a 1-in-4 lifetime risk of developing AFib, or atrial fibrillation, a common heart rhythm condition. Scheduling regular visits with your primary care doctor and any specialists you see can help catch problems sooner rather than later, which can be lifesaving in some cases.

Especially if you experience high blood pressure or high cholesterol, make doctor's visits a priority to keep a close eye on your heart health. At Ascension St. Vincent's, our teams of primary care doctors and cardiologists, including those at our hospital in St. Johns County, can provide you with the most effective screening methods to check for heart disease and other conditions.

#### Tip 2: Monitor Your Heart Health

Many of our patients use personal technology, like portable medical-grade EKG devices, to help monitor their hearts from home. These devices can help doctors detect heart rhythm irregularities sooner, which can sometimes help make a diagnosis or even prevent a stroke. But not all technology is created equal. For example, a less complex heart rate monitor and one that is built to be an EKGgrade device may show differing results.

### Tip 3: Avoid Excessive Stress

We all experience stress, but excessive and prolonged stress can contribute to heart issues like blood vessel constriction and high blood pressure, elevating the risk of a heart attack and stroke. Regular exercise is a key stress reducer. Whether it's a brisk walk, yoga, or a fit-



ness class, physical activity benefits both the heart and mental health.

### Tip 4: Focus on Moderation

Alcohol is often linked to heart problems, notably increasing the risk of AFib. An observational study in the European Heart Journal found that even one daily glass of wine or beer led to a 16 percent higher risk of developing AFib (compared to not drinking). AFib, in turn, increases the risk of stroke, heart failure, and cardiac arrest. While enjoying a glass of wine is fine, moderation is key. Exceeding two drinks in a day is never heart-healthy.

#### Tip 5: Stick to Healthy Eating Habits

Try to limit salty foods, such as canned or processed foods. Also limit high-fat foods, such as red meat, cheese, and baked goods. When it comes to a hearthealthy diet, the important thing is to maintain balance. A Mediterranean-style diet high in vegetables, fruits, lean proteins, and whole grains has been shown to promote weight loss and reduce heart disease risk.

#### Tip 6: Know the Signs of Stroke and Don't Delay Treatment

Recognizing the warning signs of stroke can protect both yourself and your loved ones. The important acronym to remember for identifying a stroke is B.E. F.A.S.T. That stands for balance, eyes/vision loss, face drooping, arm weakness, speech difficulty, and time to call 911. It's common to mistake or minimize the signs of stroke, but don't delay treatment. Call 911.

It was special because they were going to meet God and His children there. It was special because the week would start in God's house. It was special just because it was special.

The Scripture tells us, "Let us draw near to God with a sincere heart and with full assurance that faith brings, having our hearts sprinkled to cleanse us from a guilty conscience and having our bodies washed pure with water. # Road to Redemption: Travis King – the Strength of Small Groups

Small groups, or life groups, had their beginnings with the new church, as baby believers met in one another's homes, breaking bread together and encouraging each other. Those first home churches though were just that - small, intimate, home churches. Small groups today are quite different - they're typically comprised of members of a larger church who spend time together outside of the regular Sunday service, doing life together, and building each other up in their faith.

To get an idea of how our modern life groups, or small groups started up, we have to travel back a bit in time to Frankfort, Germany. In 1669, a young minister named Philipp Jakob Spener had a burden for his congregation. He wanted them to have something more than just the Sunday sermon. His desire was for his flock to grow in their faith, living out their faith every day of the week. He called it a 'movement for piety'. John Wesley, impressed with the results of these small groups, some years later expanded on that idea, and here we are today.

Small groups and life groups are touted in almost every Protestant church now, offering a multitude of options for men, women, couples, new believers, specialty groups, and much more.

Travis King knows all about the immediate and eternal impact of small groups. He refers to his current faith walk as a "beautifully painful road," and describes himself a few years ago as "broken physically, emotionally and spiritually."

Travis has learned how being surrounded by other Godly men, learning from them and growing with them, has given him spiritual endurance.

In 2021, Travis was devastated and consumed by hurt. He lost his job, his wife divorced him, and his sons didn't want to have anything to do with him. Painful though it was, God used



it for good. As C.S. Lewis so beautifully articulated, "God whispers to us in our pleasures, speaks in our consciences, but shouts in our pains. It is His megaphone to rouse a deaf world."

Travis knew he needed help. "We need hope, and where does that hope come from? God orchestrates things in your life. Over time you get to where the things of earth – the daily fears and concerns – don't affect you the same. There's a peace and hope that the Lord will walk with you and help you."

But Travis also knows that it takes consistency in reading and studying God's Word, consistency in surrender, and consistency in attending his small group to experience the growth that only comes from the Holy Spirit. "Piece by piece God softened my heart and my sons' hearts. That made me feel valued and worthy. Now I can share what God has done. You have to lay it all down and surrender it. God has to orchestrate it and direct it."

Being part of a small group is a powerful thing. Meeting together weekly, reading the Word, sharing struggles, praying for each other and being transparent with each other produces a feeling of safety and security. When you feel safe, it's much easier to grow. And then, as Jesus commanded us, we need to go – go and tell the world about forgiveness of sins in Him and eternal life.

Jesus is coming back very soon, and we still have much work to do, bringing in the lost sheep. So, get yourself plugged into a Bible-centered small group so you can be better equipped to go out into the harvest fields.

There are two movie assignments I've often given some of my coaching clients, especially if they are preparing for job interviews.

One is "The King's Speech." Featuring Colin Firth in the role of the future king of Britain, George VI, the plot deals with the to-be king's predisposition towards a stammer. He consults with Lionel Logue, an Australian speech and language therapist after experiencing disaster after disaster in his ability to communicate. Through a series of exercises, some cringe-worthy, Lionel works with the king, to the point that in 1939 the king must broadcast a speech to the British citizenry following the declaration of war on Nazi Germany. Relying first on Logue's orchestration, he

begins delivering his speech, and at the end is speaking freely. For me, it is an outstanding illustration of how a coach mentors a client across a seemingly untenable pathway as they progress from point A to point B.

Another important movie (though less renowned) is "Akeelah and the Bee." This 2006 drama tells the story of 11-year-old Akeelah Anderson, who competes in the Scripps National Spelling Bee. Akeelah attends Crenshaw Middle School, a predominantly black school in South L.A. Noting her special talent for spelling, the school's principal encourages her to sign up for the school-wide spelling bee, a request she initially rebuffs. After reconsidering and participating in the competition she is observed by a visiting English professor, Dr. Joshua Larabee (Laurence Fishburne) who decides she is good enough for Nationals and becomes her spelling coach. Making a connection between the rhythms of spelling and skipping rope, Akeelah eventually proceeds to capture her own "crown."

What is your memorable speech or academic contest moment? How did you go about determining your zone, the rhythm

in which you best function? • In a job interview?

- When giving a presentation or speaking to a group?
- In how you go about your daily assignments?
- In the way you prepare a meal? • With the manner in which you connect with and communicate

with others?

Routine works well for many people, something those who grew up on a farm where livestock were raised might particularly understand. I knew some dairy farmers in Missouri. Dairy cattle require consistent milking, at least twice, and sometimes as often as three times daily. That requirement comes seven days a week, vacation time and holidays included. That routine is instilled at a young age, so much so that the learning curve is steep, if not impossible, for those seeking to try their hand at the dairy business who are not products of the multi-generational heritage.

Cadence can be variable in other occupations. A masterful storyteller incorporates pause, inflection, and hesitation to encourage emotion, reaction, and a feeling of suspense among those listening. Dynamic preachers employ similar tactics.

Some succeed with a rhythm that is their brand. The chef, Emeril Lagasse, introduced flair, tempo, and passion for food prep viewership that "turned things up a notch" for that industry segment.

In setting your own pace, I've identified some keys, especially in interviewing and other interpersonal skills that are critical in attaining that delicate balance between being in control, without being "controlling."

Breathe. Seems counterintuitive, yet I'm continually amazed at how many of us stumble through speaking faster than we can think.

Condense it. Unless delivering a speech, a response of no more than 90 to 120 seconds seems about right in an "interlude."

Hesitate. Pause before answering. Even three seconds can give you the chance to organize your 90-second comment.

Eye contact. I have had seemingly distracted clients look away from or beyond me.

Question. Remember to ask

the audience with which you're engaged.

Storytelling. A good storyteller builds in inflection and emphasis and varies the speed of their delivery.

Uniqueness. What differentiates and distinguishes you?

Countenance. A smile and positive, optimistic body language go a long way.

But, soft! What light through yonder window breaks?

It is the east, and Juliet is the sun. – William Shakespeare, Romeo and Juliet

With Spring comes warmer temperatures and possible heat emanating through our windows.



For a time when I worked in

a cubical, I often dreamed of having a view, even if it was of the parking lot, something to let in natural sunlight. treme of replacing our windows with expensive new ones.

Did you know there's a solution? It's called ERF (energy reflective film). I know what you are thinking, another tintgreat-tried that, didn't work or my HOA won't allow it. 

This progression eventually breaks handles and damages the track the rollers sit on. There are different levels of track damage, but the longer you let it go the more extensive and expensive the repairs can get.

We get stuck, noisy, difficultto-open sliding glass doors rolling open like new again. This includes roller replacement, track repair, door handles, security locks, alignment, and lubrication
